# Education & Training by Brother Secretary Tom Gordon

The Diverse History of National Sojourners membership -In early 1918, only Master Masons who were U.S. Army Commissioned Officers were accepted into our organization.

- -December 1918, U. S. Navy Commissioned Officers and Navy Chief Warrant Officers were accepted into our organization, but not Army Warrant Officers.
- -June 1919, Commissioned Officers of the U.S. Marine Corps and U. S. Coast Guard were added.
- -January 1922, the Commissioned Corps of the U. S. Public Health Service was added.
- -1948, U.S. Air Force Commissioned Officers were added.
- -June 1950, U.S. Army Warrant Officers were added.
- -June 2001, Senior Non-Commissioned Officers of all services were added.
- -June 2016, all ranks of military personnel were added.
- -2021, members of the U.S. Space Force were added.

Since the inception of National Sojourners, membership has been predominately current and former military personnel; however, a category of honorary membership dates back to 1922 and is limited to United States citizens, who are Master Masons, and who are ineligible to become Active Members, but who have rendered conspicuous and meritorious service to the Nation and/or Freemasonry.

The criteria for Honorary membership is addressed in the National Constitution and Bylaws, so any consideration for Honorary membership must be discussed with the Chapter Secretary before a membership application is prepared.

## This month in military history

27 March 1945: Gen. Carl Spaatz sends Eighth Air Force against Berlin to destroy the Luftwaffe. Spaatz realizes the enemy would defend Berlin, so he sends bombers



over the city with P-51 Mustang escorts. General Galland of the Luftwaffe later said, "Whenever our fighters appeared, the Americans hurled themselves at them. Nowhere were we safe from them."

During World War II, Eighth Air Force earned a reputation as a great warfighting organization. Originally, the U.S. Army Air Forces activated the Eighth at Savannah, Georgia, on 28 January 1942 with three major subordinate units: the VIII Bomber Command (BC), the VIII Fighter Command (FC), and the VIII Ground Air Services Command (GASC).

## Procedures for New Memberships Initiation Dates and Membership Dues/Fees

Applications with Dues/Fees, for New memberships into the Harrisburg Chapter #76 must be received by the Chapter Secretary before the monthly meeting the month prior to the month's meeting in which the candidate is to be Initiated into the National Sojourners.

Candidates seeking membership will be Initiated as New members at the Chapter meetings on April 11th and June 13th. Therefore, Applications with Dues/Fees of Candidates must be received by the Chapter Secretary prior to the monthly meetings of March 14th or May 9th.

The applications for membership will be voted upon by the Chapter members present at the March and May meetings. Candidates will not be Initiated as Members at the same meeting in which their Applications are received.

New Member's dues for the calendar year 2024 are \$68.00 for those Candidates being Initiated in the April 11th or June 13th meeting. Membership-In-Perpetuity in \$733.00.

Candidates for membership will again be Initiated at the November 14th meeting, so any applications after June need to be given to the Chapter Secretary before the monthly meeting of October 10th. Dues at that time will include the 2025 annual dues, so the application will then require a payment of \$92.00.

Master Masons that wish to experience our Chapter's meetings and Programs are welcome to attend our meetings, as a guest.

Colonel Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin was initiated and passed in Oak Park Lodge #864 in Montgomery, AL in February and April 1955. He was raised at Lawrence N. Greenleaf Lodge #169 in Denver, CO in February 1956. He took his York Rite Degrees and Orders in Waco, TX in May 1967. He is a member of Clear

Lake Lodge #1417 in Seabrook, TX and Montclair Lodge #144 in NJ. He is also a 33° Scottish Rite Mason in the Valley of Houston S.J., a Knight Templar, a Shriner, and a National Sojourner. Brother Aldrin was initiated as a National Sojourner at the Annual National Convention in Cocoa Beach in June 1969 just before his July 1969 moon landing. Of note, Brother Aldrin flew the Scottish Rite, S.J. Supreme Council's flag on the moon. That flag is now on display in

the Masonic Museum of the Supreme Council Scottish Rite Temple in Washington, D.C. In addition, Brother Aldrin carried with him a Special Deputation from the Grand Master of Texas constituting and appointing him as Special Deputy of the Grand Master, granting unto him full power in the premises to represent the Grand Master as such and authorize him to claim Masonic Territorial Jurisdiction for The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Texas on The Moon, and directed that he make due return of his acts.
